- Manage and update content on social media channels of Global JIG;
- Manage and track progress on key tasks;
- Follow-up and track inputs from contributing journalists and editors worldwide;
- Keep minutes and information on key CWGL meetings regarding the Project;
- Assist with content on social media channels of Global JIG;
- Assist with tasks from time to time that require urgent attention regarding JiG.

#### **Required Skills:**

- Currently enrolled in a graduate program of journalism, gender/feminist studies, or related.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills in English;
- Ability to effectively communicate and liaise with different groups and cultures;
- Computer literate and knowledge of MS Office;
- Experience with research or project tools an advantage;
